[GIDDINGS, TEXAS | November 20, 2025] – Interested in learning how rainwater harvesting can help you conserve water and reduce your water bills? Join us for a FREE Rainwater Harvesting 101 Workshop on December 16, 2025, from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM at the Lee County AgriLife Extension Office, 310 S Grimes St., Giddings. This workshop will provide practical tips and insights into setting up a rainwater harvesting system for your home and garden.

This session will be led by a Bastrop County Master Gardener who has presented two prior workshops with the Lost Pines Groundwater Conservation District. Their experience teaching local homeowners, gardeners, and landowners makes this an excellent opportunity to learn from someone who understands both the science and real-world application of rainwater harvesting in Central Texas.

Those who attend this workshop are eligible to apply for the Rainwater Harvesting Rebate Program where LPGCD will give you one dollar for every one gallon of tank storage capacity, up to five thousand dollars.
